Sensitive Content Advisory

Primary Themes

1. Environmental Trauma

- Descriptions of environmental disasters
- Animal deaths and illness
- Habitat destruction
- Long-term environmental damage
- Community health impacts

Note: Some students may have personal experience with environmental disasters or health impacts from pollution.

2. Corporate/Government Misconduct

- Cover-ups of environmental damage
- Corporate negligence
- Government complicity
- Public deception

Note: May challenge students' trust in institutions or raise concerns about their own communities.

3. LGBTQ+ Content

- Character coming out as gay
- Family acceptance/concerns
- Social pressures
- Identity concealment

Note: Important to handle with sensitivity, particularly in diverse classrooms or communities with varying views.

4. Mental Health Considerations

- Anxiety about environmental issues
- Social pressure and stress
- Identity struggles
- Emotional overwhelm

5. Indigenous Content

- Traditional knowledge
- Sacred sites
- Cultural perspectives
- Historical mistreatment

Teaching Recommendations

1. Classroom Management

- Establish safe discussion guidelines
- Allow students to opt out of sensitive discussions
- Provide alternative assignments if needed
- Create support systems for affected students

2. Parent Communication

- Inform parents of content in advance
- Provide opt-out options for sensitive discussions
- Share resources for further discussion at home
- Be available for parent concerns

3. Support Resources

- Have counseling resources available
- Provide environmental action resources
- Share LGBTQ+ support information
- List cultural support services

Professional Considerations

- Know your school's policies on sensitive content
- Be aware of community standards
- Have administration support
- Document your approach
- Stay within professional boundaries
